Recording your Presentation

Many speakers will be technically proficient and will already know how to produce online presentations. Please feel free to use any format or platform of your choice that will be compatible with *Vimeo* (see 'Uploading your Presentation' below).

For those who would appreciate some guidance, please consult the list of video guides for different ways to record a presentation:

PowerPoint

PowerPoint is a simple way of recording a video presentation on a platform with which many of us will be familiar:

Google Slides

Google Slides record in a similar way to PowerPoint but require use of a third-party website for recording:

Panopto

Panopto is also a popular platform used by academics producing presentations for distance learning:

Zoom

Zoom is a well-known video conferencing platform, but can also be used to pre-record presentations and with which you can incorporate PowerPoint slides:

Adobe Premier Pro or VSDC Free Video Editor

If you want to be truly creative, you can record your presentation using a camera (Webcam or a phone camera is fine especially if you use even the cheapest tripod for stability) and utilise video editing software to edit video, add slides, images, video content and music to really liven up your presentations. This method requires some technical knowledge and can be time consuming. Adobe Premier Pro is a very good tool with a range of features or VSDC Free Video Editor is a very sufficient alternative which does not require a paid subscription and has a simpler interface.

Uploading your Presentation

Your video presentation will be uploaded to a private *Vimeo* server.

Please email your presentation to both francesca.mussi@northumbria.ac.uk and adam.d.curry@northumbria.ac.uk by the close of Sunday 20th June 2021.

As your file will be too large to send via email, we will require you to share your recorded presentation in one of three ways:

1. You can upload your presentation to a **cloud drive** (Dropbox, Google, etc.) and send a shared link.
2. The conference organisers can send you a **Dropbox File Request** via email to which you would simply attach the presentation file. Please email adam.d.curry@northumbria.ac.uk if you would like to receive this type of link.
3. Alternatively, if you have a personal video sharing platform (*Vimeo*, *YouTube* etc.), you can upload the file yourself and email a copy of the **Embed Link** and the **Video Link** (please ensure you allow embedding in the settings).
